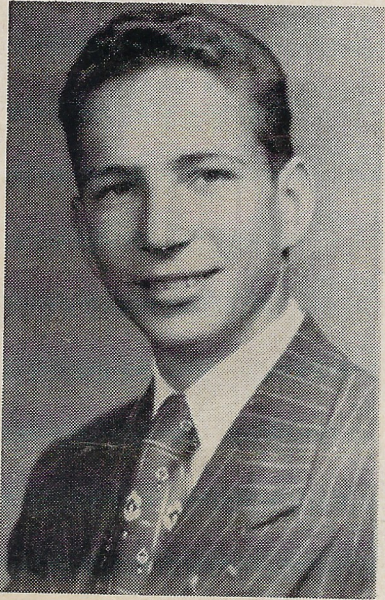

Here are a few of the things that Mr. Darling talked about in connection with the procedure of applying for summer jobs:

Go directly to the employer—don't write letters. Most employers have at least 25 letters for each job.

Don't talk about the pay right away. If the employer asks you, just say, "the current rate". If you say \$25 and the job pays \$30 you can see what would happen.

Watch your appearance, girls! Bobby sox and bandanas are a sure sign that you're not very grown up.

Find out if there are unions in the place where you wish to work. They cost money!

If you decide to go job-hunting with your pal, apply separately for jobs. Most employers, for reasons unknown, won't hire in groups.

Some of the best opportunities for summer jobs are found in small restaurants, especially on the Cape. There aren't too many summer jobs around Fall River or Somerset, for most stores hire permanently.

We hope these tips are of some value for those who are a little green when it comes to job-hunting.
