Attention Juniors!

MEDFORD, MASS:—Tufts College is again sponsoring a Pre-College Guidance Conference for secondary school juniors on June 25 and 26. Young men and women students of the Class of 1952 will live on the college campus, meet future classmates and friends, discover their aptitudes and abilities, and talk with the college faculty about their qualifications for admission and scholarship aid.

Students interested in liberal arts, the sciences, and engineering will attend. The undergraduate schools visited will include Liberal Arts (Men), Engineering, Religion and Jackson College (Liberal Arts for Women).

The program includes the administration of aptitude and vocational preference tests, personal interviews with representatives of the Committee on Admissions, appraisal of the ability to meet college admission and scholarship requirements, and an introduction to the social, academic and athletic facilities of the college.

Students may secure conference applications by writing to the Guidance Conference, Ballou Hall, Tufts College, Medford 55, Mass., or from Mr. Kaylor at Room 202.

Good Government Day

The annual "Good Government Day", by means of which almost every high school in the state has an opportunity to send a student to learn how Massachusetts governs itself, was held Friday, May 18, 1951.

The day's activities started at 9:45 when his excellency Paul A. Dever spoke to the student politicians. After his address, he introduced the student Governor, Edward Bordeau of Pittsfield. Governor Bordeau welcomed the joint session and remarked to them how fortunate they were to be able to witness the functioning of the legislative and administrative works of Massachusetts.

At the close of his address, the student Representatives attended committee on bills which were to be voted during the afternoon session. A representative who was not assigned to a specific committee could attend any one of the hearings and take an active part in the discussion. The six bills which were debated were:

1. An act making First Aid a required course in high school.
2. An act establishing the registration of football officials.
3. A legislative act to create a state commission on children and youth.
4. A legislative amendment concerning the election of governor and other state officials.
5. An act providing for the citizens of Massachusetts to vote at eighteen years of age.
6. An act providing for a course of practical politics to be taught in high school.

The interesting committee hearings lasted until 12:00, and then the students went to the Old Boston City Club where luncheon was served under the auspices

of the Massachusetts Elks Association.
